

# PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



THE LOGAN COUNTY 4-H/FFA MARKET STEER SHOW, SALE, AND CARCASS CONTEST IS A TERMINAL LIVESTOCK SHOW THAT CONSISTS OF SIX INTERDEPENDENT PARTS. THE EXHIBITORS AND STEERS MUST PARTICIPATE IN THE ENTIRE PROGRAM.

- All young people who have a Logan County address or attend a Logan County School or Russellville Independent School, who meet 4-H, FFA, or Junior Cattlemen requirements are eligible to participate.
  - 4-H : Livestock Club member 9-19 yrs old as of Jan. 1, 2026
  - FFA : Logan County FFA Chapter 9th - 3 yrs after graduation
  - Jr. Cattlemen : Education Completed 9-21 yrs old
- Steer must be registered at the December Weigh and weigh-in in March to participate on Show day
- No Market Heifers
- Exhibitors are allowed to weigh in up to 3 steers but can only show two on show day
- No bulls
- No horns
- Steers are required to be on the grounds and weighed in by 11 am on show day
- Steers must weigh at least 1000 on show day
- Steers are required to be halter broken by show but is strongly encouraged to be halter broken by March weigh in.
- Steers are shown by weight

## RUSSELLVILLE LIVESTOCK MARKET

- Exhibitors are allowed to weigh-in up to three steers but can only show two. Siblings may co-tag calves. Any calf that is going to be co-tagged must be identified at the initial weigh in.
- Steers will be tagged, de-wormed & given a complete vaccination program at registration/weigh-in day. Exhibitors may elect to not vaccinate if the animal has had up to date vaccinations.
- Show tags are to remain in the steers' ear throughout the entire program. If a tag is lost or needs to be replaced, contact Leann Martin or Maci Venable immediately. Pictures and documented proof of lost is required.
- To qualify to be Logan Proud, the steer must be born on a farm with a Logan County address. Any steer wanting to be labeled as Logan Proud must have the Producer Form Signed by the December Weigh in.
- No bulls or bullocks will be registered at the December weigh-in.
- Steers are encouraged to be dehorned by the December weigh-in but must be completely dehorned & healed at the preliminary weigh in. Scurs are allowed
